AMANA NEWS AND NOTES

Rural East Amana Property Fire

Amana volunteer firefighters were called to the property of Chris Dunn, rural East Amana, Saturday, Dec. 4, about 8:30 p.m.

Neighbors spotted the fire and reported it. The fire involved an outbuilding on the property, a recreational vehicle parked beside it and an old tow truck. No injuries were reported. The Norway and Fairfax Fire Departments assisted the Amana volunteers in fighting the blaze which was contained.

Burglary Attempt Tuesday in Girls Town

A home in the southwestern portion of the village of Amana known as "Girlstown" saw an attempted burglary Tuesday morning.

Iowa County Sheriff Rob Rotter reported to the ASI Bulletin Tuesday, Dec. 7, that someone removed a couple of basement screens from a home in Girlstown, Amana in an unsuccessful attempt to gain entry to the home.

"This type of burglary attempt is very concerning because the homeowner was likely present when the attempt was made," Sheriff Rotter stated. "This is the time of year that residential burglaries really take off on us. Burglars are hoping Christmas presents are purchased and laying in a nice easy pile to load up."

"Please remind folks now more than ever, to keep the doors locked, the outdoor lights on, or at least on a timer or motion activated, and report any suspicious activity in your neighborhood, immediately," he concluded.

Also remember to keep garage and shed doors locked, as well as all parked cars.

CCA High School Students Post Strong Achievement Scores

As per legislation, starting in 2019 the State of Iowa began a "Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP)" test administered to all Iowa high school students. The assessments are aligned with the Iowa Core standards.

The ISASP was not administered statewide in 2020 due to COVID but was most recently taken in spring of 2021.

At Clear Creek Amana, the high school students scored in the 80th percentile for all three grade levels. Overall, CCAHS scored an average of 8.6% to 12.3% higher than the state average proficiency for English/Language Arts, Math and Science. Not one grade level fell below state proficiency. The 9th graders tested 14% higher in English/Language Arts and 11% higher in Math. By category for the high school, English/Language Arts was 12.3% higher than the state average proficiency, Math was 8.6% higher and Science was 10% higher. Only 10th grade students take the science assessment.

"The spring ISASP results at the high school

were nothing short of amazing. The entire student body and staff should be very proud. This is a testament that despite the daily challenges of last year, the entire staff set the tone that we can overcome those challenges we were facing and keep the focus on learning. Given the results, the students stepped up and responded accordingly. While I know our staff and students will continue to work for improvement, these results are something to truly celebrate." "Our school district community has so much to be proud of when reviewing the academic achievement of our high school students during these unprecedented times," said Interim super-
