Arrests in Connection to Iowa County Burglaries

Two people were arrested March 17 at Sudbury Court Motel and RV Park on Highway 6, in Marengo following the investigation of recent burglaries in Iowa County.

Officers with the Marengo and Williamsburg Police Departments and the Iowa County Sheriff's office executed a search warrant at Sudbury Court.

Austin Lawson, 26, and a female, Mason Allie, 21 were taken custody March 17. Lawson was charged with burglary first and third degree, attempted burglary, theft, criminal mischief, possession of controlled substance, methamphetamine, and possession of drug paraphernalia. Allie was charged with possession of burglary tools, possession of methamphetamine and possession of drug paraphernalia.

It should be noted that a criminal charge is an accusation and the persons charged are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

By the time we reached high school Mrs. Ruff had gotten this idea of putting a library together and going back to graduate school to learn to become a librarian.

It began with reconverting the north west room in the high school and assembling and organizing all the books.

She must have done it by herself because I just remember walking into the room and finding it complete with tables and chairs one fall day.

The library would move from room to room and student librarians recruited meanwhile Mrs. Ruff would order, catalogue, print up cards, and shelf books never saying anything.

It was at this point I want to make note of something few people know. She was the first certified librarian which meant she could have been a librarian from K - College because she had PASSED graduate work in the field.

The great majority of school librarians have only taken college courses as under-graduates and often don't know how to correctly catalogue a book much less write rules of behavior and ordering books. (The library board actually has the right to censor books.)

Anyway, Mrs. Ruff did all this plus organize plays, run the school newspaper, chaperone trips, etc. without any extra pay. One wonders if many people would do that these days.

Looking back I'm glad to have gone to a small school where people worked together for a common goal which was the betterment of thier children.

I remember teachers paying for children's lunches, getting extra clothes for them and going to thier homes to help with lessons. These are the "good" memories.

MY AMANA EXPERIENCE

As promised, we'll be exploring the Amana RV Park this time.

I thought I'd visit in early spring to talk with Jamie Scott, Manager of the Amana RV Park, and Jessica Presson, Front Office Specialist, as they might have some time to chat. Not that they were lounging around the office - quite the opposite.

Get ready for the next two paragraphs because this is a sampling of what they've been up to since the park closed for the season last fall.

In the first two weeks of January, they took over 1,000 reservations for the coming season. The on-line reservation system is now up and running, with more requests arriving daily. They're also very excited about a new marketing campaign. They are updating their policies and procedures to ensure a great experience for every visitor, using this time to research new trends in camping, and surveying previous guests. There are approximately 15 seasonal staff members to interview and hire, and new equipment (electrical transformers and washers and dryers), has arrived. Did I mention they are setting an event schedule that includes over 60 contracts for new or recurring events? They are.

There are 10 wedding receptions (they can accommodate up to 650 people) on the schedule this year, 15 RV groups are booked, and if you like happy dogs doing what makes dogs happy, have they got events for you! There's obedience, flyball, diving dogs, dogs chasing lures, and beautiful dogs just strutting their stuff. I've suggested including events with cats. It's only a matter of time, I'm sure of it. They also handle the Renaissance Festival at the park in Middle Amana, Beckster Fest, and so much more.
