AMANA NEWS AND NOTES

Amana Village Bicycle Repair Station Open

Now a low tire or a broken spoke on your bike need not slow you down as the Amana Colonies Trails, Inc. volunteers have placed a bike repair station on the street near the bike rack at the Hotel Millwright, just before you cross the Mill Race bridge.

Steve Gatz and Dennis Gormley, Amana Colonies Trails volunteers, installed the repair station which looks like waist-high, steel post, but has a cleverly designed array of useful bike tools inside (secured by long steel cables so they can't be stolen) and a tire pump that will fit both common bike tire valves. Gatz and Gormley had help from Jim Plowman of Custom Cutlery who created the stainless steel washers needed to install the station properly.

Gatz is a member of the AC Trails board and a bike riding enthusiast. He was inspired by friend Ron Heitmann. "This is something I felt we needed. Ron carried bike tools and a pump in his truck, so when we rode together we could count on Ron. I was thinking we needed a bike repair station near or on the Amana Kolonieweg trail especially one with a tire pump." Gatz and his family donated the \$2,200 to buy and install the station.

What's neat is that the station will be listed on the apps (like Dero.com and others) used by avid riders to locate bike trails, bike racks, free air pumps and repair stations, so this will help visitors find the bike repair station in Amana. But Gatz and the Amana volunteers want to encourage all locals to use the bike station to. "I think it makes it easier, because it has air that's free, it's very handy to get to and it has both the common types of tire value connectors and all the tools you might need to make a basic repair."

A MESSAGE FROM THE ACLUD BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

It will be an exciting time to have the RAGBRAI bicyclists pass through the Amana Colonies later this summer on Friday, July 28th. Since their visit with us is relatively short (10 am to 4 pm that day) the Board of Trustees felt it appropriate to have a reduced price for any temporary commercial signage that would be displayed that day. Normal permit fee for temporary commercial signs is \$40 per sign, the Board voted on April 10th to reduce that to \$10/sign for the RAGBRAI event.
